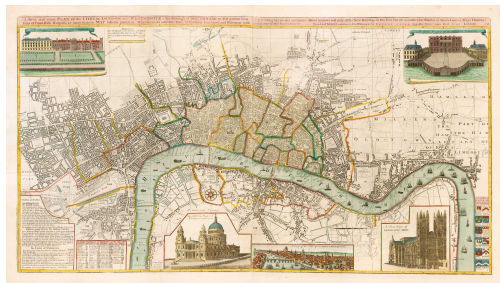




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AN 18TH CENTURY TWO-SHEET PLAN OF LONDON
